

## **Roland Classroom Activity: HP201 Piano**

**Lesson: Sound Detectives** 

**Concepts:** Identify Instruments in

Orchestration

Grades: K-6, 30 minutes

## **Preparation:**

Preview interval SONGS: #10: Golliwog's Cakewalk

#24: To The Spring #51: Le CouCou

Paper and pencil for each student

Preteaching: Instrument families: wood-

wind, brass, strings, percussion

## National Standards Met:

Standard 6: Listening to, analyz-

ing, and describing music

Students listen to SONG files and

identify instrument tones

Standard 8: Understanding relationships between music, the other arts, and disciplines outside the arts.

Students identify categories for instrument tones

## **Detailed Lesson Plan:**

Note: Song files are a suggestion. Feel free to substitute or add music that is age and culture appropriate. Although not in the internal memory of the piano, a contemporary music selection would spark the musical interest of all students. (think pop, country, jazz genres)

- 1. Review Instrument Families: woodwind, brass, string, percussion
- 2. List the Families/Categories on the board.
- 3. Brainstorm and list instruments for each category
- 4. Explain that student will listen for these (and other) instruments as they listen to a variety of music.
- 5. Erase families and list title of first piece: Golliwog's Cakewalk
- 6. Students copy title onto their paper.
- 7. Play Golliwog's Cakewalk
- 8. As students listen, they list as many instruments as they hear.
- 9. Brainstorm together, on the board, the combined list of instruments.
- 10.Discuss findings: "Wow! Look how many heard that flute; great ears!"
- 11.Identify which Instrument Family each would belong to. Example: the flute would belong to the woodwind family.
- 12.Repeat Steps 5-11 for a variety of music.
